Began as a billboard painter in New York, scaling up small collages to make large paintings. By 1960, he stopped painting commercially and began working in a style that would become known as Pop Art. His more recent works involve space and relativity.

What is **POP ART**?

- >An art movement made popular in the 1960's >Used imagery from pop culture (advertisements,
- comic books, product labels)

Rosenquist's method for making art:

- >RE-PURPOSE imagery collected from magazines or ads.
- >SCALE up his small collages by using a grid
- >PRINT MAKING allows him to make many copies of one image
- >PAINTING allows him to make very large works
